Subject: Visual Art

Date: October 2, 2025

Topic: Scribble Animals

Notes: If students choose pencil crayon for colouring, you can introduce simple shading techniques to add depth and detail to their artwork. Provide students with visual of animals.

Brief Lesson Overview:

Students will explore their imagination by turning random scribbles into animal drawings, using inspiration from Saskatchewan wildlife.

Materials Needed:

Pencil, white paper, markers, crayons, or pencil crayons

Learning Outcomes:

CP4.7-Create visual artworks that express own ideas and draw on sources of inspiration from Saskatchewan.

Structure / Activity:

1. **Scribble** – Use your pencil to make a big scribble on your paper. Don't overthink it!
2. **Find Shapes** – Look closely at your scribble. Can you see shapes that remind you of animals found in Saskatchewan (e.g., deer, fox, moose, owl, beaver, goose)?
3. **Outline** – Trace over the shapes you notice and add details to turn them into animals.
4. **Colour** – Use crayons, markers, or pencil crayons to bring your animals to life.
